the spark that encouraged me to ask our state to contribute to the Fund\$ for Florence Project.

In October, three days before our Fall Executive Board Meeting, chapter presidents were sent an email requesting gift cards for our 27 teachers needing assistance. On October 13, 2019, \$1,350 in gift cards were distributed to those teachers who worked in schools either destroyed or damaged by flood waters.

Region X, hosts for the 85<sup>th</sup> Convention and Birthday Celebration, decided to continue the project to assist our members affected by the hurricanes rather than choose a project in their region. The convention project was named Fund\$ for Florence.

State Organization Presidents in the southeast reached out inquiring how they could assist. We received money from Alabama, Mississippi, and Virginia! Cashier's checks or gift cards have been sent to the designated 27 DKG member teachers throughout the year.

At the Maryland Fall Executive Board meeting, it was decided that they would raise funds throughout the year. In the spring, President Sharon would come to North Carolina and visit schools to bring gift cards to teachers. On April 8, 2019, Sharon visited Brinson Elementary School in New Bern, NC, and personally distributed gift cards to four NC DKG (*Alpha Psi*) teachers. Past Region II Director Tammy Cullom represented NC DKG that day in New Bern. Alpha Psi had members at other schools that were affected by the hurricanes, and they received gift cards as well.

Sharon also visited Trenton Elementary and Jones Middle School that were destroyed due to the hurricanes. She visited teachers from those two schools at Jones High School with Gamma Epsilon Chapter President Jackie Lanier to distribute gift cards. Jackie delivered gift cards to other affected teachers in her chapter.

I have been amazed at the generosity of our NC DKG members. Chapters have sent money to purchase new books for libraries and sent money directly to these teachers.

A total of \$13,296 has been distributed to 27 NC DKG educators! Share the Sparkle!

# Amendments Approved at the 2019 Convention

The members of The North Carolina State Organization of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International (formerly known as Eta State), abbreviated as NC DKG, voted to approve all the presented amendments to the *NC DKG Bylaws* and *Standing Rules*. The proposed amendment to Article V Organization, Section 2. New Chapters B was withdrawn before voting.

The NC DKG Rules Committee, with the input from convention workshop attendees, will be revising the draft checklist that chapters can use to make updates to their chapter rules based on the 2019 approved amendments. The final checklist will be emailed to chapter presidents and posted on the NC DKG webpage.

One amendment that NC DKG passed stated that the state Rules Committee will make immediate changes to state rules following an International DKG Convention where proposed amendments were adopted. This should be a model for your chapter rules, where your chapter will make immediate changes following the International DKG Convention and also after the NC DKG Convention, as needed. This will be stated on the checklist for you.

While you are making these recently adopted changes to your chapter rules, please visit the NC DKG webpage and find the standard chapter rules checklist. Print it and check that all recommended items are part of your chapter rules so they are as up-to-date as they can be. The next official chapter rules review by the state Rules Committee is scheduled for 2020.

Chapter Rules are a living, breathing document that may change to meet the needs of the group. A report and vote during the business section of your chapter meeting are all it takes to make necessary changes. If you have questions, please contact Chair Tammy Cullom. Other committee members of the Rules Committee are Becky Keesler, Barbara Piekarski, and Tobey Worthington.

Funds received for the Brick Paver Project (2016 through 2018) totaled \$15,000. Payments for brick pavers (2018-2019) were \$2,883.14. Mr. Woodard and his company will start the work as soon as the weather cooperates.

President Connie Savell, Delta Tau, called the Spring Executive Board meeting to order on Friday afternoon.

The NC DKG Executive board took the following action:

• Heard reports from select officers and committee chairs. All officer and committee reports were printed in the convention program.

- Approved the recommendation of all presented amendments to the *NC DKG Bylaws* and *Standing Rules*. The proposed amendment to Article V Organization, Section 2. New Chapters B was withdrawn before voting.
- Announced the Fall Executive Board Meeting on September 14, 2019, at the First Presbyterian Church, Burlington.
- Approved a motion that the 2021 NC DKG Convention be held at the Crowne Plaza Resort in Asheville on April 23-25, 2021.
- Approved a motion to accept revisions to the 2019-2021 NC DKG Strategic Plan.
- Accepted the Eta State NC Financial Review as presented.
- Accepted the report from Pat Taylor, Mu, Ad hoc Committee Chair, to explore three convention sites.
- Approved an Ad hoc Committee to investigate the pros and cons to every member voting on amendments. Members of the committee are: Ashlee Taylor-Layton, Barbara Piekarski, Pamela Wright, Connie Savell, Betty Marshall, & Gwen Simmons, consultant.
- Approved the motion for Alpha Theta Chapter to expand in 2020. The new chapter, in Stokes County, will be named Delta Upsilon.

Members enjoyed entertainment by the South Caldwell High School Jazz Ensemble 1 under the direction of Jonathan Stafford at the opening of Awards Night on Friday evening. Hickory mayor, Hank Guess, welcomed attendees to Hickory. Dr. Barbara Day, Delta Beta,

# NC DKG 2019 Founder's Award Presented to Betty Debnam Hunt



The NC DKG Awards Committee presented the prestigious 2019 NC DKG Founder's Award to Betty Debnam Hunt during the convention Birthday Brunch in Hickory. Mrs. Hunt was nominated for the award by Delta Xi Chapter (Region II, Pitt) in recognition of her notable and outstanding contributions to improve the quality of life in

North Carolina's young people, educators and parents through her creation of *The Mini Page*.

Delta Xi member, Linda Teel, shares, "Early in her career, Mrs. Hunt's love of teaching coupled with her journalism background, inspired her to create the renowned *The Mini Page* providing a platform that captured minds as well as making learning interesting and fun for a diverse group of learners, *The Mini Page* has and continues to provide meaningful educational content to a global world."

A native of Virginia, Betty Debnam Hunt moved to Raleigh, NC, at age twelve. She is a graduate of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and received a masters degree from Duke University. She taught elementary school for twelve years.

While teaching first grade, Mrs. Hunt was inspired to create a mini-unit, something that would provide teachers with easy access to information. She had the idea to condense a social studies unit to one page with an interesting introduction for teachers that would lead their students to do more research. *The Mini Page* was created for children but was of interest to readers of all ages as well as educators.



Mrs. Hunt credits her family for her inspira-

tion for *The Mini Page*. Her grandmother ran a small weekly newspaper; her grandfather was a school superintendent and edited the newspaper, and her father was a reporter in Norfolk. Her spouse, retired Marine Col. Richard Morton Hunt, was a former *Raleigh News & Observer* and Associated

Press reporter, lobbyist and military adviser for the late Hubert Humphrey.

Mrs. Hunt's four-page weekly newspaper feature addressed topics of significance to the elementary curriculum including science, government, animals, hobbies, artists, holidays, biography, geography, history and manners, among others. Recognized for its cast of cute characters purposefully drawn like "...a talented 4-year-old" did it, *The Mini Page* topics were carefully researched, written in an easy-to-understand-style and double-checked by top sources in the country. Each issue also had recipes, super sports and puzzles based on the main theme.

The first issue of *The Mini Page* ran in the August 29, 1969, issue of the *Raleigh News & Observer*. In 1970, *The Mini Page* was picked up by *The Charlotte Observer*. In 1977, *The Mini Page* was syndicated nationally. The educational resource appeared weekly in over 500 newspapers.

In 2007, Mrs. Hunt established an online *The Mini Page* Archive at UNC Chapel Hill University Library. Issues of *The Mini Page* are free to download and print from the archive.

Betty Debnam Hunt wanted to be known as an educator and someone who made a difference. Thank you, Mrs. Hunt, for your outstanding contribution and dedication to education and lifelong learning. Yes, you have made a difference! NC DKG is proud to recognize your dedication to students and to education.


